



District Governor's Message

Spring is almost here: today I noticed crab apple trees and forsythia in bloom. What a welcome sight! Hoping this cold spell won't last long.

If you recently drove Hwy 22E/Fullerton exit area, I trust you "looked up" and saw our D14K sponsored Lions Billboard. Sadly it's presence will vanish around April 1st.



We had great attendance (48 present) at our **Annual Bowl-a-thon**. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves: Mountainville Lions accepted the challenge of being "most spirited", along with PDG Karlene Laub (Lehigh Twp Lions) bringing back the leprechaun. Lions have FUN! Thank you to all who pledged monies and who purchased raffle tickets. Thank you Lion Donna Bok for taking reservations and organizing this district fundraiser. Club Treasurers are to collect the pledge monies (keep 60% in the club) and send one check (40%) from club made payable to District 14-K Lions. All District proceeds will be directed towards Hearing Impairment.

Thank you also to all who attended the **Sights-for-Hope Needs Breakfast** on 3/22 at Blue Grille in Bethlehem. It was g-r-e-a-t to see so many Lions in one room! Past Executive Director/Lion Doug Yingling was honored with the Accessibility Champion Award. At the close of the event, \$32,000 was either donated or pledged to Sights-for-Hope 2021-2022. Some clubs indicated their contributions will be forthcoming from their club's year-end disbursement of general welfare funds.

On the return bus trip, Lions are providing transportation for refugees to flee into other countries for safe housing. LCIF is sending disaster relief funds to assist. 
Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) updates





These glasses will be distributed to those in need supported by Lions International. In addition, we boxed over 200 pair of reading glasses that will be distributed to homeless shelters. I still remember when my orientation and mobility instructor came in and told me about Leader Dogs for the Blind and their summer experience camp. I was sixteen and looking for guide dog schools.

[Soon] I was on a plane to Michigan for the best and busiest week of my life. As soon as I got there, I knew I was going to have an amazing time. I had the opportunity to experience so many things I never would have had the opportunity to had it not been for Leader Dog. They had tandem biking, ziplining, rockwall climbing, beep kickball, scavenger hunts, game nights, driving simulators, and so much more. The best part, though, was that I got to experience all these activities with other blind and visually impaired teens. I made so many friends that week, and to this day, three years later, I consider some of those people some of my best friends.

If you ask any alumni from camp what their favorite part of the week was, there's a 9 out of 10 chance that they're going to say, "Dog Day." This is the day when we got to work with a guide dog and a guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) to learn about what working with a guide dog is like.





PENNSYLVANIA PIN TRADERS PIN SWAP 2022


