

These classes are general 45 minute topics, with a short 7-10 question quiz following.

To all our District Governors, District Leo Chairs, Leo Club Advisors...

I want to start by asking each of you to review the "group" this message is being sent to. These are the contacts I have for your district. If you notice any names that should come off or know of any names that should go on, please let me know at the name and email address.

In last month's message, I encouraged all to attend the 2021 Virtual Leo Leadership Forum. I did register and was able to catch several of the sessions – one of which was "Reporting Membership." Reporting Membership is important for many reasons, but several reasons were stressed: (1) Each Leo's years of service is recorded. Many Leos go on to become Lions – if their membership is NOT reported to Lions Clubs International (LCI), their years of service will NOT follow them into Lions. {example: My granddaughter was a Leo and when she became a Leo-to-Lion, she carried over 6 years of service. She received her 10-year chevron after 4 years in the Lions Club.} (2) When completing a college or employment application, Leos can list that they were volunteers with their Leo Club – employers and colleges are very interested in volunteers, but if their membership is NOT reported, there is no proof of membership.

Does your Leo Club have a newsletter? This is a way for you to share your accomplishments and upcoming activities with your sponsoring Lions Club, your school and the communities you serve. I have included, as an attachment, this month's Penbrook Lions and Leos Newsletter. Both feature summer activities of the Penbrook Leo Club and its members. If your Leo Club has a newsletter, please share it with me. I'd love to read what our Leos from around the state are doing.

Have you searched through the Leo Resources? If you missed last month's issue, you can find these resources by going onto the LCI Website (www.lionsclubs.org), click RESOURCES FOR MEMBERS, click RESOURCE CENTER, and click LEOS.

Also, under the RESOURCES FOR MEMBERS, you will find the LIONS EVENTS CALENDAR. There are two August 15 deadlines for Leos – applications for (1) the **Leo Club Excellence Award** and (2) **Leo Club Program Advisory Panel**. Links to both are on the calendar. The Leo Club Excellence Award link will also take you to the many, many ways you can award and recognize your Leos and Leo Clubs.

I recently received the digital "MD Digest," from LCI, and the following was included:

Endorse a Leo Club for the Leo Club Excellence Award – All districts may endorse one Leo club to receive the prestigious Leo Club Excellence Award for the 2020–2021 year. Districts must submit applications for their top Leo Club by August 15 to Lions International.

2022–2024 Leo Advisory Panel Nominations Open – District Governors and District Leo Chairpersons will be asked to approve any applications submitted by candidates from their district. All applications must be received by August 15 and approval emails will be sent from Lions International to the approved candidates the third week in August.

All PR grant recipients must show they made a minimum of a 10% match to their grant award in the required post-report."

People from all over continue to donate these things every day, but there is a much more deep-seated gift from the heart that can save a person's life. For many young people who do not have the ability or means to donate these things, they have so much more to offer others than they realize because they have the most valuable gift of all! They have the gift of life by becoming an organ donor!

And for one very special person whom we all love and who has given so much of herself to make our communities grow over the years and become more stronger than ever, she just keeps on getting closer to the five-year life expectancy of receiving kidney dialysis. I can't even imagine what it's been like for my dear friend Alice Jones to be receiving dialysis three times a week for four hours at a time no matter what the weather is like - rain, shine, snow, sleet or ice – she just has to be there! I know because I talk to her every chance I can to help her pass the time while she is receiving dialysis.

I want to tell you about our friend Alice! She has served countless families and children through her many years of service at the Allegheny Intermediate Unit. But there's much more! Membership in a Lions Club will be one of the finest things in the life of every man if he makes it such. The estimate which each individual Lion places upon himself is an accurate gauge of the esteem in which the Lions Club is held by the community at large; and a Lions Club composed of members who do not fully appreciate the honor which has been bestowed upon them in their selection as members of the club, cannot find fault if the public fails to appreciate their club as it should be appreciated.
