



District 14-K Continues Focus on Recruitment at Second Cabinet Meeting

The second District 14-K Cabinet Meeting on November 16, 2019 was opened by host chairperson Lion Jasper Torcia at the Brass Rail Restaurant in Emmaus. After the preliminary opening the call to breakfast was announced.

Governor Don Kaufman called the meeting to order and welcomed all Lions and guests. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved along with the treasurer’s report and financial report.



Reports from the District Offices:

District Governor – report included the DG’s official visits, the need for candidates for the Regional Lions Institute event, sale of PA State Pins, Call-Em-All phone system (operational), and the need to add new members (one per club by years end).

1st VDG Dan Lombardo – report included need to be “optimistic” and “confident” before achievements are made. Lion Dan wishes Lions would focus on what works instead of what doesn’t work.

2nd VDG Deb Lillegard – Lion Deb attended a “mock” preliminary DG council meeting during the MD State Council meeting in Wilkes-Barre, PA. Key members of the MD including ID Larry Edwards, PIP Joe Wroblewski, PIP Frank Moore III, and PID Cindy Gregg presented. This was a great learning experience into how the council works.

Global Leadership Team Coordinator: GLT Zachary Miller reported on the District 14-K Convention and efforts to create a “Global Action Retreat” for attending Lions. Global Membership Team Coordinator: GMT Cindy Kaufman reported the total membership of the District is down eight members since July 31, 2019. It was also mentioned that four dropped members from Coopersburg Lions will be reinstated. Lion Cindy ask each club to

Zone Chairpersons: Reports were given, listing activities and fundraiser events submitted by the clubs.

Peace Poster – PDG Joe Chunko reported that we need to have more schools participate next year.

Youth Seminars – PDG Fred Folland is asking that each club consider finding candidates to attend this year’s camp. If clubs can not come up with candidates to send they can still offer to pay for an attendee.

The Cabinet Meeting was adjourned at 11:15 AM.

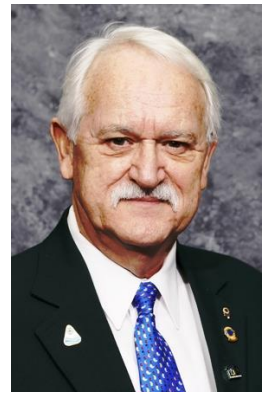

They are all service men and women FROM PENNSYLVANIA!! Their names cannot be released due to security reasons and they are in a remote area away from any services at all. This information came from a PA State

Command Officer at Indiantown Gap. I'd like your help to send 60 boxes from your district to reach the soldiers before Christmas.

Our Lions Club is asking for help from your community in adopting one of these soldiers, filling a box, and getting the word out to your family and friends.

Let's show our soldiers some love and support from back home and let them know they are not forgotten.

The box needed is a priority mail **MEDIUM** size flat rate box from the US post office.

Please don't seal the boxes because they need to be inspected for customs to ensure they don't have any restricted items. I have added a flyer with suggested items. Most people last year said they had great luck getting their items at a great price from Dollar Tree, Dollar General, Family Dollar OT Walmart.

*** Don't forget to include a little note to your soldier with your name and address. Several people received thank you notes back last year. Also please make your items generic to any sex please!

I know that we are on a time crunch but I just received this information. I know that together we can do this!! As Lions our motto is We Serve - but with your help we are able to do so much more. Help us show some love to those that are serving us every single day!!!!

District 14-K Lions, I realize this is a last minute request, and everyone is super busy with the Holidays - but if you can, **please let me know** if you would like to fill a box for the soldiers. If you don't have the time to physically fill a box, perhaps you can send me \$50 per box and I will do the rest. (The \$50 includes the cost of the items and the \$14.35 postage) Get your Lions Club members involved. It would be great if we can send 60 boxes by December 8, 2019. I will send the shipping address to you when I hear back from you.

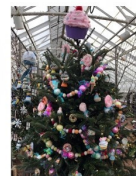

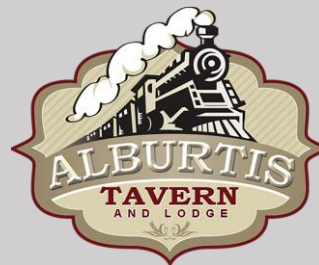
