




Thank you to all that made this event a huge success. We sold 52 raffle tickets; all winners have been notified. We sold 68 meals; we are so proud of the community support.



HOW TO FIGHT COVID AT HOME

~from a COVID Survivor

No one ever talks about how to fight Covid at home. I came down with Covid in November. I went to the hospital, running a fever of 103, with a rapid heartbeat, and other common symptoms that come with Covid. While I was there, they treated me for the high fever, dehydration and pneumonia. The doctor sent me home to fight Covid with two prescriptions - Azithromycin 250 mg & Dexamethasone 6mg. When the nurse came in to discharge me, I asked her *"What can I do to help fight this at home?"* She said:



Sleep on your stomach at all times with Covid. If you cannot sleep on your stomach because of health issues, sleep on your side. Do not lay on your back no matter what because it smashes your lungs and that will allow fluid to set in.

Set your clock every two hours while sleeping on your stomach, and then get out of bed and walk for 15-30 minute, no matter how weak, moving arms around frequently as it helps to open your lungs. Breathe in thru your nose, and out thru your mouth. This will help build up your lungs, plus help get rid of the Pneumonia or other fluids.

Sit up straight when sitting in a recliner - do not layback in the recliner, again this will smash your lungs. While watching TV - get up and walk during every commercial.

Eat at least 1-2 eggs a day, plus bananas, avocado and asparagus. These are good for Potassium. Drink Pedialyte, Gatorade Zero, Powerade Zero, and Water with Electrolytes to prevent you from dehydration. Do not drink anything cold - have it at room temperature or warm it up. Water with lemon and little honey, peppermint tea, apple cider are good suggestions for getting fluids. NO milk products, nor pork. Vitamins D3, C, B, Zinc, Probiotic One Day are good ideas. Tylenol for fever. Mucinex or Mucinex DM for drainage, plus it helps with cough. Pepcid helps for cramps in your legs. One baby aspirin everyday can help prevent a blood clot, which can occur from low activity.

We always hear of how Covid takes lives, but there isn't a lot of information out there regarding how to fight Covid. I hope this helps you or someone you know, just as it has helped me.



LION CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION REPORT

MULTIPLE DISTRICT 14, NOVEMBER 2020

Donations to LCIF are down by 40% this current Lions year while we are still in the pandemic. This is due to many clubs' fundraisers having been cancelled or postponed. There are clubs and districts in MD-14 that are being creative and going to ticket raffles and some are even having drive-through dinners. In District 14-C, they originally had a bingo night planned, but after postponing it four times, they decided to have a ticket raffle instead which was very successful.

Campaign 100 throughout the world has raised \$16 million this current Lions year and has served 4.5 million people. As PDG Kerry reported earlier, MD-14 has surpassed the \$1 million mark in contributions to LCIF since 2017, the beginning of Campaign 100. We are fourth in Multiple District donations in Constitutional Area 1.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, five districts in MD-14 have received emergency grants worth \$10,000. District 14-G has also received a \$9,000 grant for disaster preparedness and a \$1,000 Community Impact grant. Congratulations to these districts. As you can see MD-14 has really benefited from LCIF and we need to return the favor to the Foundation!

PDG Kerry and PDG Evan are very excited about a new fundraiser for LCIF in MD-14, (thanks to ID Larry Edwards and PDG Jim Cavarallo), called "Shave the Statches" in which both Directors would shave their mustaches if we raised at least \$10,000 by selling \$25.00 tickets. For every 40 tickets sold, a Melvin Jones Fellowship would be awarded to a winning ticket. If the winner already has a Melvin Jones Fellowship, they would be awarded a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship. The winning tickets would be drawn at the next State Convention held. Between ID Larry and PID Jim, their mustaches have been growing for over 100 years, so this is a great personal sacrifice for them; let us make this fundraiser a great success!

Also, clubs will be receiving LCIF donation boxes in the near future to be passed around at club meetings or put in strategic places in their communities as another way of raising money for LCIF. More information will be forthcoming on this.

PDG Kerry and PDG Evan greatly appreciate your support to LCIF throughout Campaign 100; we are asking you to continue this to make it a very successful campaign, especially with so many recent disasters during a record storm season.
