



#### **LIONS BUY VAN FOR NORTHERN LEHIGH FOOD BANK!**

Below photo shows a new van purchased for the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. PDG Karlene Laub was able to secure 2 grants from Lions organizations to cover the cost of the van. The West Lehigh Area Lions - Follweiler Northwestern Community Foundation, Inc. provided the food bank with a grant for \$6000.00. The Pennsylvania Lions Foundation gave us a matching grant of another \$6000.00. With the help of Jason Williams and the staff at Amey's Garage in Cherryville, we were able to purchase a 2017 Dodge Grand Caravan. The van is used to pick up food from the grocery stores and others who donate food. The van is also used weekly to deliver food to clients who are unable to get to the food bank for their monthly groceries. Josh Dalrymple, of JKD Design LLC, volunteered his services to wrap the van with our Northern Lehigh Food Bank Logo. For many years, prior to purchasing the van, volunteers used their private vehicles. The Borough of Slatington is also giving us the fuel for the van.


