


It's extremely important that the world knows what service we do as Lions. We pour our heart and soul into serving so let's make sure everyone knows it. Our Lions organization receives grants from large companies based on the amount of service we complete. Did you know that Bill Gates and other multi-millionaires support our causes based on the service reported? If our service reporting drops, we risk the loss of those important donated dollars!

I would be happy to assist you in using My Lion to report. Please email or call me and I will schedule time to help you.

I received my Guiding Lion Certification in February after completing the course with an instructor in the Google Classroom. The classroom was challenging to use at first, but you can teach an old dog some new tricks! I thoroughly enjoyed the experience!

Please continue to do what you can with service and fundraising until our communities open up fully. I am including a list of simple service ideas and fundraising ideas with this report. 




