On Saturday April 23rd the D14-K Election, Raffle & Eyeglasses/Hearing Aids collection will be held at the Moore Twp Recreation Center Lions Pavilion, Bath. A Necrology Service honoring those Lions who passed in 2019, 2020, & 2021 will be held this summer on Saturday, July 30th at the Bethany Methodist Church, Brookside Road, Wescosville.

Since we are missing out on our LOCAL convention, there are two other opportunities I'd like to share:

1. PA State Convention, May 19-22, King of Prussia - registration form included. Easy 1 hour drive for great learning opportunities.
2. Lions Virtual Symposium, Saturday, April 25th. Join Lions from around the world in a day of virtual learning featuring presentation and discussions about the "future of Lionism". Keynote Speaker: International 2nd VP Brian Sheehan. (See attached flyer)

LCIF - Campaign 100 is in final stage of its 3-year campaign (ending 6/30/22) to raise \$300 million for the good of Lions. District and club challenges are popping up all over to make the campaign a 100% success. Our District LCIF Coordinator Lion Donna Bok (Emmaus L-L) gave a challenge to all members to

give from their heart to this campaign. No donation is too small or too large: all donations are equally important. There will be a drawing to match donations, and a Mystery dinner.

At the recent PA State Council #3 meeting, Lion Donna Townsend was guest speaker. (She is widow of IPE Haynes Townsend.) In his memory, a sitting district governor offered challenge to all in attendance to make a donation to LCIF-Campaign 100: within 10-15 minutes, we collected over \$650.

If you are a Facebook follower, there is a group of Lions who meet other Lions regularly for a Burmester Virtual Bar. bvb.lionsvirtual.org. This weekend, Lion Daniel Elkins challenged the Lions in attendance to donate to LCIF and he would match their donation. Donations ranged from \$5 to \$5,000, raising \$11,350. Lion Daniel matched it along with a mystery agent who also committed to match up-to the first \$20,000 donated. During the event, they collected \$34,000 in donations for LCIF.

On June 5, 2022, a second LCIF Tel-a-thon will be aired to bring the campaign to a close. Mark your calendars, as this should be a FUN night of entertainment.

I mention these three examples because giving was made FUN and easy vehicles for donating to this great cause. Make a difference and help 14K meet their LCIF-Campaign 100 Challenge.

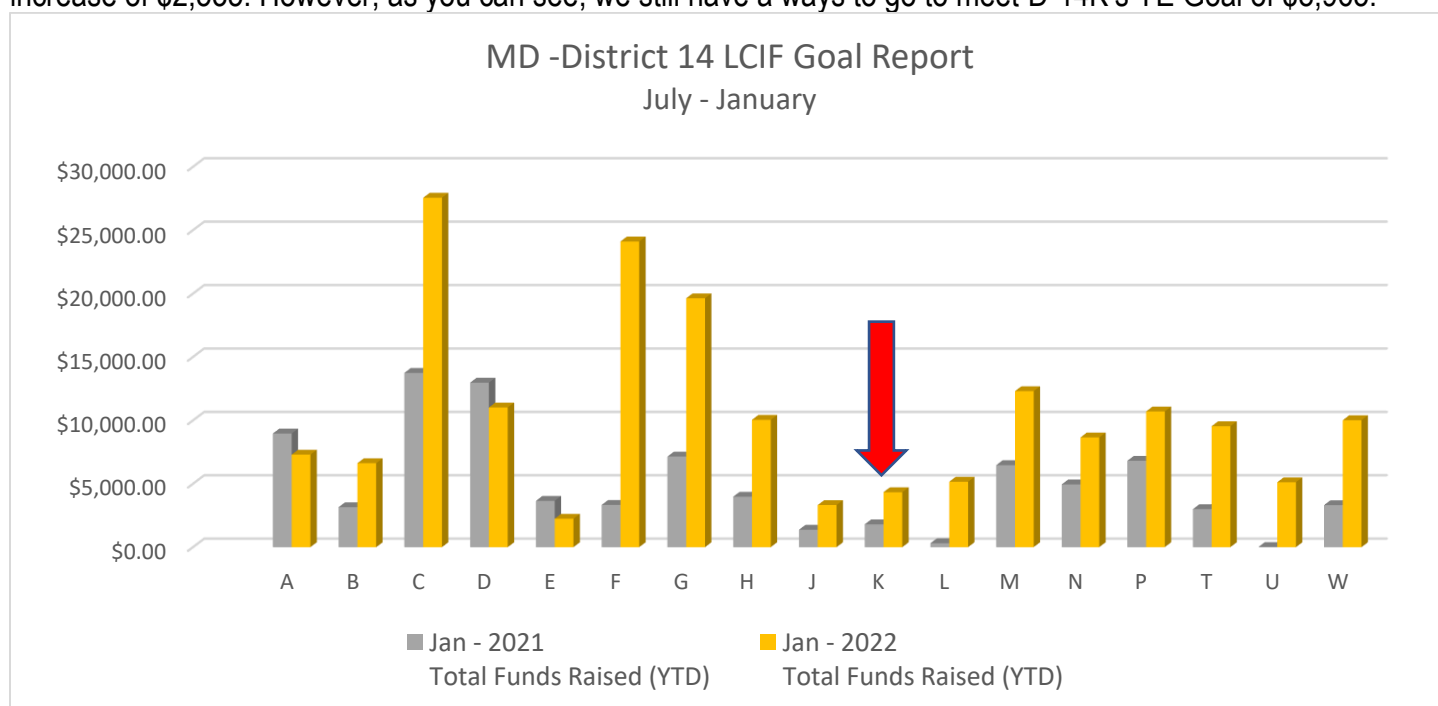
Don't forget that March is the District Bowl-a-Thon. If you are not bowling, sponsor someone who is participating in this event.

FYI! Below is a graph showing all the Districts on MD-14 for reporting months July through January, 2021 vs. 2022. The red arrow indicates our District within the group. In YR 2020-21, District 14-K ranked 14th out of 17 with \$1,800 in total funds raised. YR2021-22, total funds raised are \$4,335 with a ranking of 15th out of 17. An increase of \$2,535. However, as you can see, we still have a ways to go to meet D-14K's YE Goal of \$8,965.



As of February 18, 2022 Campaign 100 achieved US\$257,333,076 which is 85.8% of Campaign 100's US\$300 million goal.

Lion Vernon B. Altemose - 8/23/32 to 2/22/22 - Easton Lions Club

Vernon G. Altemose, Jr., 89, of Palmer Twp., PA, died Tuesday, February 22, 2022 at Moravian Hall Square, Nazareth, PA. Born August 23, 1932 in Forks Twp., PA, he was the son of the late Vernon G. Altemose, Sr. and Anna (Miller) Altemose, and stepson of Elda Stout Altemose. A 1950 graduate of Nazareth High School and a 1954 graduate of Temple University in Business Administration, Vernon was a member of the Temple Honorary Accounting Society as well as Sigma Phi Epsilon, serving as his fraternity's treasurer during his years at Temple. He was an avid baseball, football, and basketball fan of the Temple Owls, the Philadelphia Eagles, and the old Brooklyn Dodgers and Philadelphia Athletics.

Vernon was a partner in the accounting firms of Degan Messer and Co. and D.H. Messer and Co., serving as a Certified Public Accountant. For 30 years, Vernon also served as the accountant and treasurer of The Easton Home from 195 - 1988. Vernon served his community as a member of the Easton Lions Club for over 58 years, acting as treasurer for 40 years and as president in 1969. He was honored with the Lions Club's highest and most prestigious award "Melvin Jones Award". Additionally, along with his wife, Vernon was a member of and active in the life of St. Peter's UCC, Tatamy, PA, having served as a deacon and elder for over 50 years and as treasurer for over 38 years. Other memberships included: The American Institute of

CPA's, The Pennsylvania Institute of CPA's, lifetime member of the Pomfret Club, the Tatamy Fire Co., Junior Chamber of Commerce of Easton, Temple University Owl Club, and the F&AM Easton Lodge #152.

Vernon and his wife enjoyed traveling the country. His favorite place was Hilton Head Island, SC, which he visited with friends and family many, many times over the years. He took great pleasure in the beauty of the island, bicycling, walking the white, sand beaches, and local fine dining. Vernon also spent many hours zigzagging up and down the east coast, "chasing" down lighthouses, his wife's passion. Vernon and his wife, the former Kathryn "Kitt" Engler, celebrated sixty-three years of marriage prior to her death in December 2017.

Vernon is survived by his four children and their spouses: Pam Valcante (husband Gregory) of Gainesville, FL, Matthew Altemose(wife Bonnie) of Easton, Gregory Altemose (partner Kathy Haines) of Troy, MI, David Altemose (wife Rachelle) of Palmer Twp.; 14 grandchildren; 10 great-grandchildren; and sisters: Marion Starner of Lancaster County and Frances Stoudt of Nazareth. He was preceded in death by his brother: Charles Altemose and sisters: Edith Powell and Alice Pristash.

A Memorial Service will be held April 2, 2022 at 11 AM in St. Peter's UCC, 401 Broad St., Tatamy, PA. A calling period with refreshments will be held from 9:30 to 11 AM in the church fellowship hall. 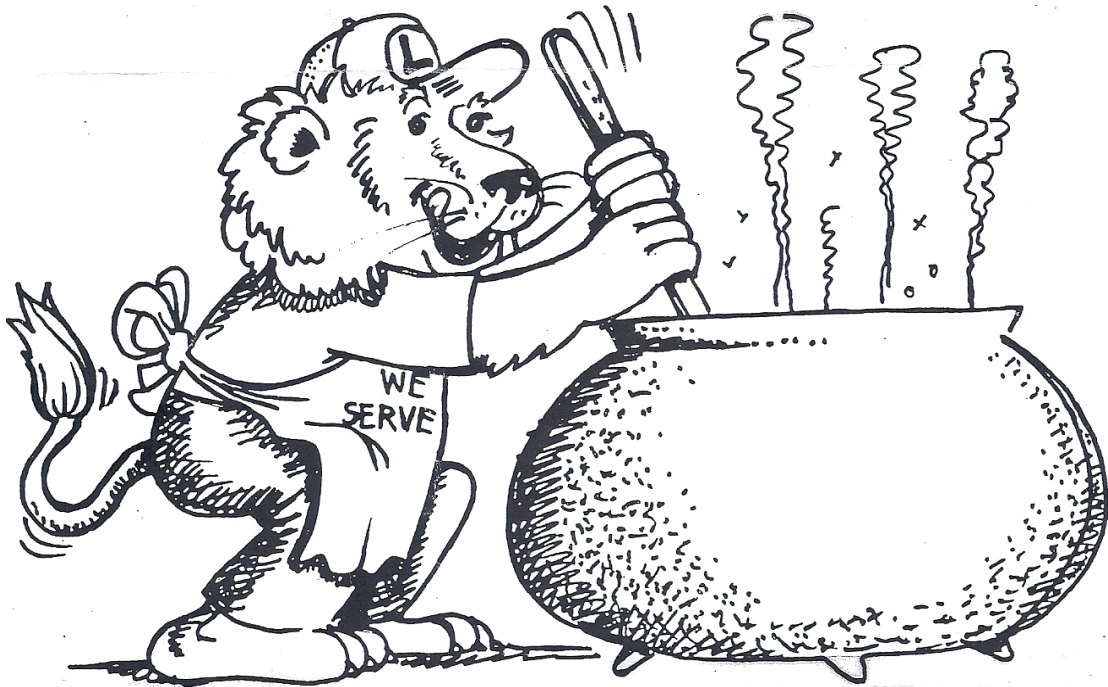

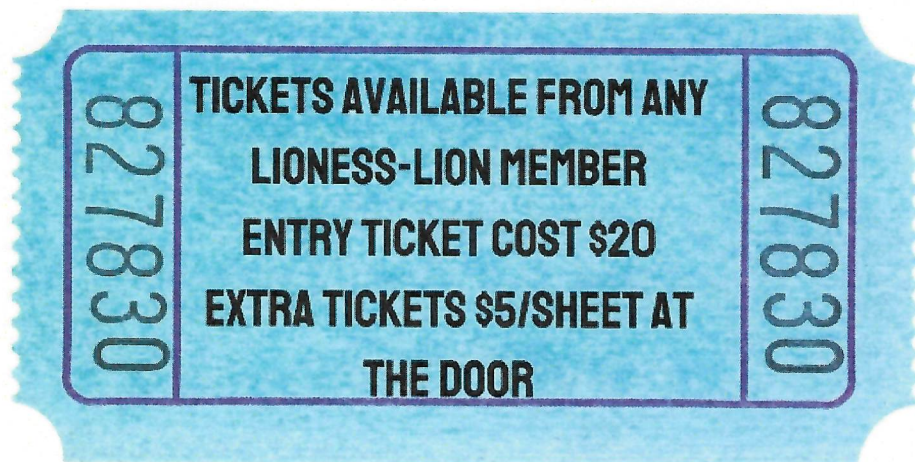

Dues Adjustment Resolution Will Be Voted on at 2022 International Convention

Dear Lion,

Lions Clubs International supports clubs and members around the world so we can advance our global mission of service together. Our international support and the work of Lions Clubs International is fueled by the international dues of our incredible members.

In recent years, it has become increasingly clear that the services Lions Clubs International has been able to provide to members with the available budget is no longer in line with what Lions need and expect.

The International Board of Directors voted in October 2019 to approve an international dues adjustment resolution that would be voted on at the 2020 International Convention, but it was postponed due to the cancellation of our 2020 convention and the move to a virtual convention in 2021 as we adapted to the pandemic. *The new dues adjustment model will be voted on at the 2022 International Convention.*

The Board of Directors undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, the board proposed to adjust dues \$7 over a three-year period.

Under the proposal, international dues would be adjusted according to the following schedule:

- \$3 increase on July 1, 2023
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2024
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2025

Why an international dues adjustment is needed

We realize the association has been reluctant to adjust dues over the years, and we have not adjusted international dues since 2011. The proposed adjustment will help cover our costs and allow us to suitably serve our members' needs. With that said, the Board of Directors did not take this issue lightly, nor are we minimizing the value of each dollar that our members contribute.

As we consider this dues adjustment, it is essential that we keep in mind that our global efforts and initiatives support more than 1.4 million members in 50,000 clubs around the world. Through the

support of staff, we are able to serve globally on the level that we do, keeping members and clubs fully supported with service resources, training events and software, club operational support, hybrid convention, international meetings, language services, technology, Foundation support, leadership support, and everything else we have come to expect as Lions.

A dues adjustment will allow Lions Clubs International to provide improved support to Lions and to continue to invest in improving programs and digital products such as our website and MyLion. It will also allow us to invest in new programs such as the Learning Management System (LMS), development of new curriculum such as digital literacy, training videos, global advertising, marketing automation, digital and video storytelling and other tools and initiatives that will enhance our impact, our brand, and our membership.

Why your help is needed

Essentially, we have to decide whether or not we want Lions Clubs International to continue to grow and thrive. Lions is more than a way of life. It's also an investment of money, time, energy and passion. As with any good investment, the more we put in, the more returns we see.

Brief history of PTCP. On July 10, 1983, five interested Lions (Jerry DeTurk, Reg Gemmill, Tim McCaulley, Amos Shatzer and Larry Shaull) met to discuss the possibility of forming an organized group to promote further pin trading interest in Pennsylvania.

With the assistance of Bill Smith, president of the Virginia Pin Traders and First Vice President of the Lions International Pin Trading Club, a provisional constitution and by laws were formulated. On July 12, 1983 letters were sent to Lions announcing the formation of the 'P.T.C. P. By the end of September 1983 Lions sent applications for membership.

The first pin, which was issued in 1984, was the "Three Roses" (see above) which honored the cities of York, Hanover and Lancaster. The first prestige pin was "The Bear" (see above) in 1989. In 1992, the two-day pin swap was instituted and the first "auction" was held.

I still remember when my orientation and mobility instructor came in and told me about Leader Dogs for the Blind and their summer experience camp. I was sixteen and looking for guide dog schools.

[Soon] I was on a plane to Michigan for the best and busiest week of my life. As soon as I got there, I knew I was going to have an amazing time. I had the opportunity to experience so many things I never would have had the opportunity to had it not been for Leader Dog. They had tandem biking, ziplining, rockwall climbing, beep kickball, scavenger hunts, game nights, driving simulators, and so much more. The best part, though, was that I got to experience all these activities with other blind and visually impaired teens. I made so many friends that week, and to this day, three years later, I consider some of those people some of my best friends.

If you ask any alumni from camp what their favorite part of the week was, there's a 9 out of 10 chance that they're going to say, "Dog Day." This is the day when we got to work with a guide dog and a guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) to learn about what working with a guide dog is like.

Preventing Scams

Popular Scams:

Phone Scams: Promise winnings or claim a family member is in trouble.

Door to Door Scams: Ask to seal driveway, or fix roof, or claim they are with the power or water company.

Email Scams: Promise winnings or prizes, usually provide a link to click on.

Prevent Scams!!!

Screen calls. Let numbers you don't recognize go to voicemail. Scammers rarely leave a message. Ask questions about the prize or ask basic questions about the family member.

Ask to see a business card. Look to see what vehicle they are driving. Ask for company ID. Call your power to water company to see if they are legitimate.

Never open emails if you do not recognize the sender. Never click on links with-in the emails.



Some Questions to ask:



How much do I have to pay to get my prize?

Ask the "family member" basic questions about themselves that only they would know the answer to.

Do you have a business card?

May I see your company ID card?

Do not believe these scammers. If you send money via gift card or electronically, you will never see it again!!! When in doubt, call 911



Red Flags:



You are asked to send money via gift card or wire transfer.

They ask for user name/ password

They have "extra materials" to do home repairs.

There is a time limit on your response.
