

Team District 14-K Food Collection All Year Event

Last year we chose to challenge our Lions and Lionesses to competitively donate to their local or any other Second Harvest Food Bank pantry over a two-month period. The need is still the same, but this year I am challenging all clubs to participate all year as a team, "Team District 14-K". Again, all non-perishable food donations will be weighed or estimated.

Last year, 82.4% of donors chose to contribute monetarily and again every \$1.00 will be recognized as an equivalent of 9 lbs. of food. The reason for this is Second Harvest Food Bank can purchase food more economically than we can and much is also donated to them by government agencies or private businesses. **You may list all donations as of July 1, 2013. Please list only one donation per form**. Only Food Pantries operating under the Second Harvest Food Bank will again be considered. The list of pantries is the same as last year.

Complete the form:


- 1. List your club name.
- 2. List the date.
- 3. List the weight of your donation or the amount of your monetary donation and its equivalent in pounds.
- 4. List the Food Pantry name on the check and the form as the Receiving Agency.
- 5. Have the Agency Representative sign as having received the check.
- 6. The completed form is then sent to the Second Harvest Food Bank; the check is kept by the Food Pantry.

I have set a goal of 50,000 lbs. and will keep you informed of our progress as the year moves on. This information and the donation form will be e-mailed or mailed to all club secretaries; feel free to duplicate the form. This information and the donation forms will also be listed on our website.

We will continue to collect non-perishable food items and monetary donations at the upcoming District 14-K Meetings. I will deliver these donations to the Second Harvest Food Bank and register these donations. I hope all attendees will participate.

Lions pulling together can do great things; let's give this our best effort.



District Governor Encourages Dedicated Service at 14-K Rally

With 227 Lions, Lionesses and Leos in attendance, the annual District 14-K Rally was held on Thursday, Sept. 27 at the Northampton Memorial Community Center.

District Governor Dennis H. Butz, basing his talk on the theme of Lions International President Barry Palmer and his own, urged the members to "Follow your dream and deliver dedicated service in

GMT and GLT Workshop Well Attended Here

A large number of Lions and Lionesses from seven districts in eastern Pennsylvania attended a workshop on membership and leadership at Christ UCC Church, Airport Rd., Schoenersville on Saturday, Sept. 28.

For the most part they were club membership chairpersons, and Global Membership and Global Leadership Team members, along with several Past District Governors and the new International Director, Cindy Gregg.

One of the leading presenters was Past International Director Yamandu Acosta of Alabama, who stressed the building of new clubs. He initiated his remarks with the comment that Lions in America are in crisis, for we have lost 11,000 members the past two years. He attributes that to the members not being happy, a lack of activities in their clubs, lack of fun, and a sense of purpose, along with a downer in enthusiasm and a love for the movement.

He said new clubs are needed to fulfill needs in the community; with young people they would be rejuvenated, and families could be attracted. Formats of new clubs

He continued, "Dreams are plans that don't let you sleep. If we follow our dream it will not lead us astray. . Someone in your community had a dream and these are the successful Lions clubs of today."

Noting President Palmer's goals of youth, feeding the hungry, and a cleaner environment, District Governor Butz listed his main goals for this Lions year: 50 new Lions, one new Lions club, chartering new Leo clubs, increasing female membership, and improving our public relations through social media. And he added, "Have fun while doing it."

Governor Butz noted that he didn't truly become a Lion when he joined the Emmaus Lions until one night during the Christmas season he visited a family and saw how Lions make a difference in someone's life.

He commented, "If we work together, success will take care of itself." DG Butz expanded his idea about the rally, "We need to rally to come back strong. We are Lions who serve to help our fellow human beings."

State Leader Speaks

Pa. State Council Chairperson Lion Charles also had "Jim" Keener remarks at the rally. He announced that only two Lions clubs in the state have had membership increases this year, and District 14-K with nine is one of them. He commented, "Clubs need to be vital, current and appealing" and noted that in a few years, 30% of our members will be females.

Also at the head table with district cabinet leaders were Past International Director Gene Polgar and guest, P.I.D. Jim Cavallaro. In brief remarks, P.I.D. Polgar urged the members of District 14-K to "Get behind our District Governor and carry out dedicated service. Follow his dream."

First Vice District Governor Fred Folland served as emcee for the rally program and PDG-PCC Lowell Hawk gave the invocation, led group **Continued on Page 2**


